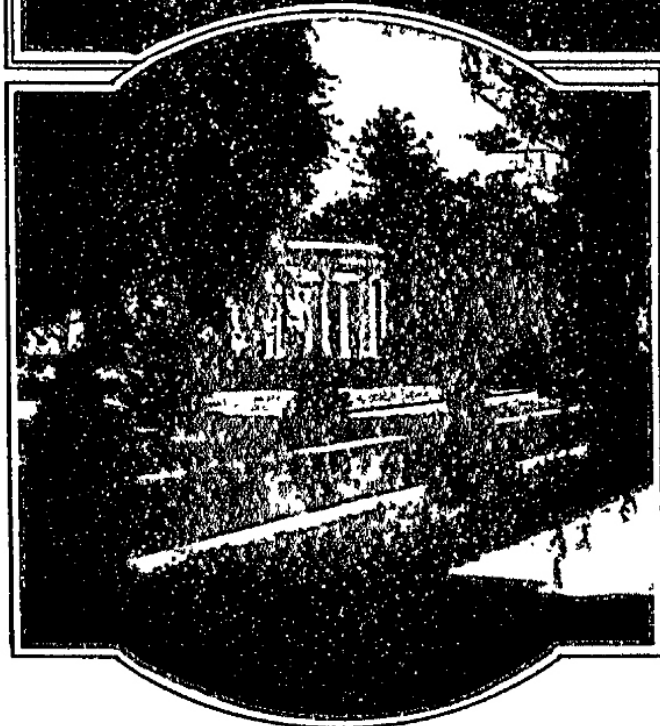
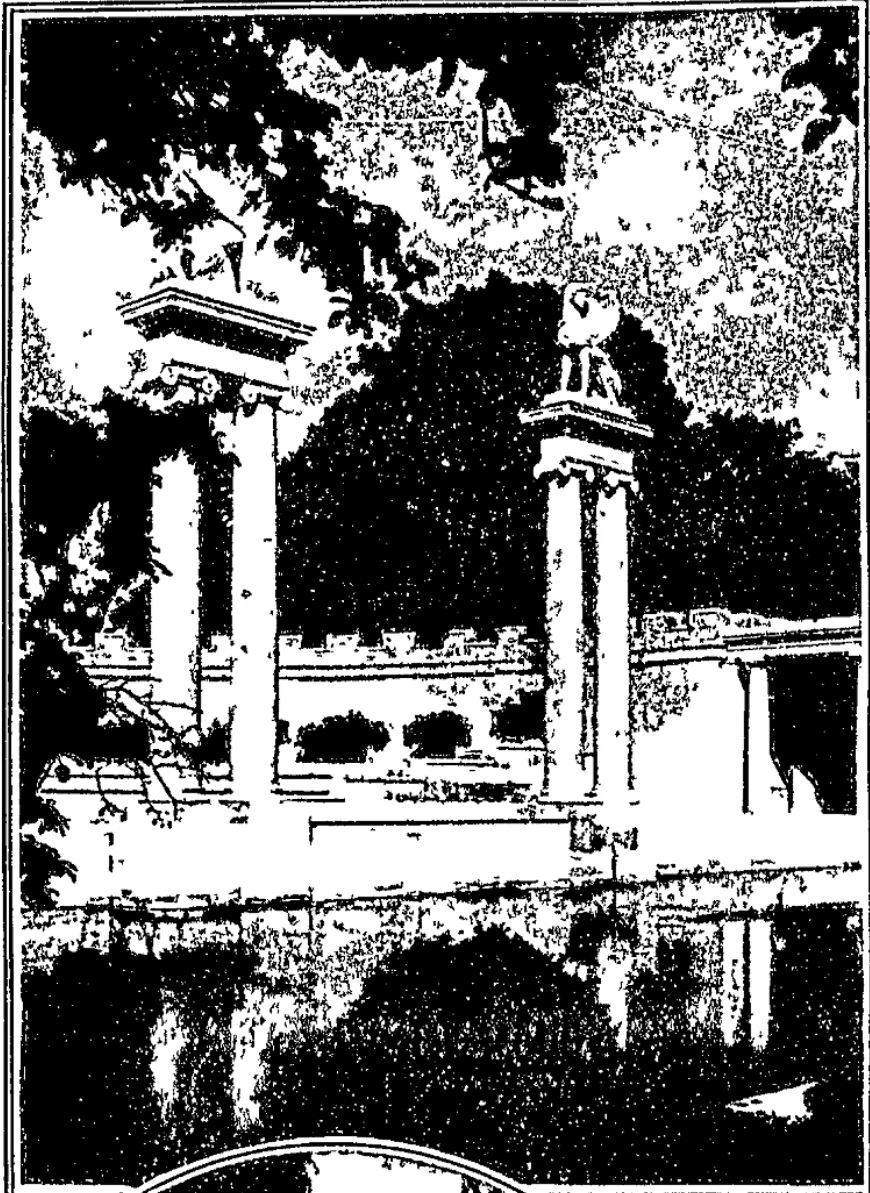


America's Most Spectacular Garden.

This country abounds in old-fashioned gardens,—in formal gardens,—and in gardens: there are, however, very few of the classic type and this Greek Garden of Samuel Untermyer's ranks by itself. Inspiring is the quiet dignity of the formal paths,—the placid waterways,—mirroring the blue green of the evergreen,—the yellow green of the early spring foliage,—and the solemnity of the glistening marble pillars. The Doric columns are an architectural feature of a large open-air Greek Theatre. As in all extensive gardens, the planting is so planned that flowers bloom in profusion from early spring to late fall. There are points of vantage from which an expanding vista is obtained, a view of the Hudson River, more than a mile wide at this point, over to the jagged Palisades of New Jersey. To maintain such a garden as Untermyer's is a privilege,—it gives pleasure, relaxation and inspiration to all those who walk through its magic paths.
